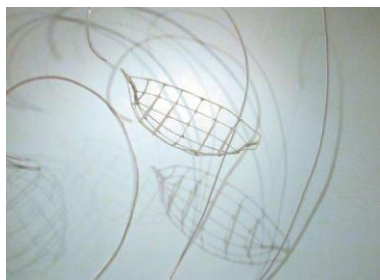
Sandra Zacharia, our wonderful Communications Coordinator has returned and is again sending email distributions to the WGG membership.

Gallery hours are Mon - Fri, 9:00 AM - 4:30 PM, Tue and Thurs, 9:00AM - 9:00 PM. In addition to that, in May, **Sue** won the honor for the 2nd year in a row of having pieces displayed in the juried exhibit, “Small Works in a Great Space,” at the Mitchell Gallery, St. Johns College in Annapolis, Maryland.

Jessica Beels’ work has been included in the Emerson Gallery exhibition, Voyage of Discovery. The artwork in *Voyage of Discovery* has its roots in the idea of a journey of scientific exploration, in the tradition of Darwin, Wallace, and the thousands of scientists who constantly travel the globe in search of new findings. This imaginary voyage takes viewers to a polar region where the iconic, seemingly eternal, landscape of ice and snow is in profound and rapid transition due to climate change. The pieces in this show, created in a wide variety of media, reflect the artists’ responses to the transformation of land and sea — the melting of glaciers, the thawing of permafrost, the movement of previously unknown species and microbes into the region, and the dramatic shift of the color of the land from white to green to black. The artists are deeply aware of the damage done by climate change, yet intrigued by the possibilities of what lies below the ice and snow.

ANNOUNCING WORKSHOP “Making Multiples with Blanking Dies,”

JAYNE REDMOND IS COMING Nov. 7-9, 2014! The WGG together with The National Enamellists' Guild are hosting a wonderful workshop. **Jayne** is presenting, “Making Multiples with Blanking Dies,” using Susan Kingsley’s book, *Hydraulic Die Forming for Jewelers and Silversmiths* as a reference.

One-piece blanking dies allow you to easily cut out precise duplicate shapes from silver, gold and other non-ferrous sheet metals. Jayne Redman has been using this method for her own production jewelry for 18 years and has developed ways of creating dies and blanking multiples that dramatically speed up the production process. In this workshop, you will learn how to develop patterns for this process and the method of sawing dies from glad stock tool steel. You will be amazed at how quickly you can go from original idea to duplicated shape as you make and use your own blanking dies during the class. Jayne will be demonstrating her own inventive methods of forming, connecting and engineering. This is a process-oriented, not project-oriented workshop, although, if you have a specific design in mind, Jayne would be happy to work with you to solve your problem. Revere Offers Jewelry Biz Essentials and CAD

For the first time, San Francisco's Revere Academy will offer two new classes that are "beyond the bench," according to Alan Revere, the school's founder. Jewelry Biz Essentials is a new class for those who are entering the industry with an eye on manufacturing. In addition, the Academy now offers two classes in CAD, computer-aided design, in the Winter/Spring 2015 Open Session, which runs from January 2 to May 9, 2015.

Jewelry Biz Essentials is totally new program, which outlines how to run a small jewelry business and market contemporary jewelry. Intended for designers, makers and manufacturers, the class draws broadly from the combined experience of three contemporary working jewelry artists. These three instructors offer essential information for anyone who wants to sell their own creations. This class covers pricing, promotion, production and much, much more. Award winning designers Michael Sturlin, Jenny Reeves and Luana Coonen each bring their own experience and wisdom to the conversation, as they coach each individual toward a path of success after leaving the Academy.

CAD, computer-aided design, is the subject of two classes in the coming term. Students who are new to CAD learn to navigate and use 3DESIGN, one of the most popular programs for jewelers, in the beginning CAD class. The Advanced class brings additional skills to use in creating more advanced and intricate 3D models. The week-long classes are taught by Vasken Tanielian, one of the few classically trained goldsmiths who is also expert at CAD-CAM.

Alan Revere BENCH TIP

How To Determine If Surfaces Are Flat

Filing surfaces flat is easier said than done. But when you consider the importance of this skill, and how often it is used, then you better figure out how to do it right.

Here's a trick to make this task easier. Based on the machinist's use of bluing, this technique employs permanent markers to help indicate where the metal on the surface is high or low.

Take a permanent marker and cover the surface to be flattened. Now hold a file to it and take one stroke. Did it remove all of the ink, revealing a flat, bright metallic surface? Or is only part of the ink removed, with the slightly recessed areas still covered with ink? If so, you now know exactly where to apply your efforts. Repeat the inking and filing; as you continue, the file will remove more and more of the ink with a single pass, until you have one flat, even surface.

REMOVING STUCK STONES - September '14

Every jeweler who sets stones has experienced getting their stone stuck in its setting prior to finishing their piece and setting it. If you haven't made a hole in back of your setting to punch out the stone, there is a remedy. Use a small piece of softened lost wax casting wax and press it on top of your stone—and voila, the stickiness will lift your stone right out of its setting.

CREATE A VIRTUAL DESIGN NOTEBOOK - June '14

Layout all your components on a flat surface and take a photograph. You can easily add captions to the photo describing how you plan to connect the various parts of the piece.
